Reflections from Taipei: MedInfo 2025

MedInfo 2025 united the global Nursing Informatics community within the wider field of health informatics under a clear message: change, consistency, and connection.

Across four days, dialogue spanned AI ethics, governance, education, and technical standards—always circling back to inclusivity and patient partnership. Panels raised challenging questions: Whose voices are missing? Who benefits from AI in health?

Ulla-Mari Kinnunen Education sessions highlighted both the promise of AI in training and the risks of siloed approaches. Governance debates called for transparent nominations, mentorship, and stronger international collaboration. Technical sessions reinforced the enduring importance of HL7 and FHIR in achieving interoperability.

> Key takeaway: As health knowledge continues to expand, we must embed clear frameworks, inclusive governance, and integrated education. Guided by shared values of inclusivity, ethics, and compassion, IMIA NI is well placed to ensure nurses remain central to digital health transformation.

MedInfo 2025 brought the global Nursing Informatics with the larger Informatics community together offering a clear message: change, consistency, and connection.

The IMIA NI General Assembly 2025 was held virtually via Teams on September 4–5, 2025. The event focused on advancing nursing informatics globally, with updates on strategy, membership, advisory panel, communication and upcoming initiatives.

Chair's Welcome:

Nick Hardiker, Chair, emphasised IMIA NI's role as the global representative body for nursing informatics.

Strategic Updates:

Approval sought for the refreshed IMIA NI Strategy (2025–2028), focusing on empowering nurses globally through innovative digital tools and technologies.

Objectives and strategic recommendations focused on fostering international collaboration, increasing visibility, promoting good practices in nursing informatics, and supporting AI governance.

Membership Report:

Current status: 29 society members, 27 honorary members, and 3 institutional members.

New society member: Lee Woods (Australia).

Honorary member nominations: Judy Murphy and Inge Madsen.

Advisory Panels:

Four panels (Education, Governance, Practice, Research) are driving priorities such as AI literacy, data standards, and care planning.

Next steps include appointing missing Co-Chairs and fostering cross-panel collaboration.

Communications Report:

A refreshed IMIA NI newsletter launched in January 2025, with monthly updates and strengthened global engagement via LinkedIn.

Key topics included AI in nursing, International Nurses Day, and tributes to nursing informatics leaders.

NI2028 Update:

The next Nursing Informatics conference will be held **November 2–5**, **2028**, **at Caesars Palace**, **Las Vegas**. **Theme**: "Pushing Boundaries—Digital in a Nursing World."

Goals include global collaboration, evidence-based practice, and professional growth.

Country Contributions:

Updates from member countries highlighted activities such as workshops, conferences, and policy engagement.

Next Steps:

Strengthen global collaboration and advocacy for nursing informatics.

Continue refining the newsletter and promoting engagement.

Prepare for the 2026 General Assembly and NI2028 conference.
