Global Nursing Informatics: Evidence and Insights



- **Digital technology research in nursing is expanding sharply**

Recent bibliometric analysis shows nursing informatics research is growing, especially around artificial intelligence, virtual reality, and big data, with calls for enhanced digital competencies and standards in practice.

- **Artificial intelligence integration continues to reshape nursing practice**

Reviews in nursing literature indicate AI is increasingly used for clinical decision support, patient monitoring, workflow optimization, and personalising care — while also highlighting the need for ethical frameworks and workforce readiness.

Society Membership

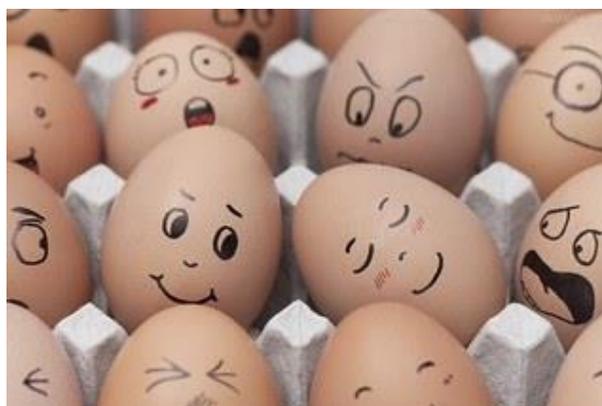

When / Where: 9–12 March 2026 — Las Vegas (HIMSS26).

Why relevant: World’s largest health IT conference; strong clinician and nursing informatics content, major industry, policy and implementation streams (useful for leadership, system-level digital health).

- **EFMI — Medical Informatics Europe (MIE 2026)**

When / Where: 25–28 May 2026 — Genova (Genoa), Italy.

Why relevant: EFMI's flagship European medical informatics meeting; includes tracks on education, digital health, AI, interoperability and opportunities relevant to nursing informatics.

- **AIDH / HIC2026 (Health Informatics Conference)**

When / Where: HIC2026 — organised by the Australasian Institute of Digital Health (AIDH). (AIDH events page / HIC page listing and registration information).

Why relevant: Australasia's peak digital health conference — strong local relevance for Australian nursing informatics, education, workforce and implementation topics.

- **ICN NP/APN Network Conference 2026 (hosted by a university)**

When / Where: 14–17 September 2026 — Nashville, Tennessee, USA (hosted by Vanderbilt University School of Nursing; endorsed by ICN NP/APN Network).

Why relevant: Although this is the ICN NP/APN network conference (advanced practice nursing focus), it is ICN-affiliated and university-hosted — good for practising nurses and nurse leaders working with informatics in advanced practice settings.

- **IMIA (noting 2026 IMIA activity — General Assembly / IAHSI / regional meetings)**

When / Where: IMIA lists **General Assembly and IAHSI plenary meetings in October 2026 (Buenos Aires)** and other IMIA regional events in 2026; **MedInfo** (IMIA's large congress) is scheduled for **2027**

Why relevant: IMIA is the global body for biomedical & health informatics and IMIA-NI is the recognised nursing informatics — IMIA events and working group meetings are the most authoritative places for nursing informatics activity.

Emory's Simpson named to the 2026 Georgia Nursing Hall of Fame

The Georgia Nurses Foundation has announced that Roy L. Simpson, DNP, RN, FAAN, professor and assistant dean for data science education at Emory University Nell Hodgson Woodruff School of Nursing, will be inducted into the 2026 Georgia Nursing Hall of Fame. This prestigious honor recognizes nurses who have made enduring contributions to practice, education, research, and community well-being across the state. Internationally recognized for his leadership in nursing informatics, data standards, and artificial intelligence, Simpson helped establish clinical informatics as a specialty recognized by the American Nurses Association and co-authored the scope and standards for nursing informatics certification.

Across more than four decades, Simpson has authored over 600 publications and three books, received numerous national awards, and served in leadership roles within organizations including the American Medical Informatics Association and the American College of Medical Informatics. At Emory, he co-directs the Center for Data Science, advancing nurse-led AI innovation and big-data research to improve patient safety and health outcomes. He is one of 10 nurses selected for the 2026 cohort and will be honored at an induction ceremony in Atlanta on February 26.
